During New Student/Parent Orientations knowledge is shared by Florida State University PD and the Dean of Students. Knowledge imparted is basically “informational” in nature. Formal/official information will be shared regarding criminal activity, emergency situations, and means that individuals should adopt to preclude their becoming victims. Knowledge-sharing will focus on people-to-people interactions. Next is sharing about our campus-wide emergency notification system. The fifth type of knowledge-sharing centers on students themselves. Knowledge is power and is used as a tool to assist our students and others in making the right decisions.
