University of Mississippi

A University of Mississippi police officer was killed Saturday (10/21) morning after stopping a driver for speeding on campus. The driver, a 20-year old University of Mississippi student, suddenly pulled away dragging the officer for approximately 200 yards. The driver has been arrested and charged with capital murder of a police officer.

The officer, Robert Langley, was a four-year veteran of the University of Mississippi Police Department who had just returned from National Guard duty in Afghanistan.

I have no further details at this time that would support officer safety training objectives.

I do know that IACLEA President, Steve Healy, has made telephone contact with the Chief of Police at the University.

Miles College (AL)

On Sunday (10/22), two police officers were shot, one fatally, in Fairfield, Alabama near the campus of Miles College. Classes at Miles College were cancelled on Monday as one of the shooting suspects remained at large.

Ohio State University

Twenty-four people crowded onto a dormitory elevator before it pinned and killed an Ohio State University freshmen. The 18-year old victim was the last person to enter the elevator on the third floor of Stradley Hall before it began to descend with the doors open, according to campus police.
