Please provide all information requested below. Incomplete proposals will not be considered.

Title of Proposed Session

1. Primary/Coordinating Presenter

Name, title, institution, address, phone, fax and email. IACLEA will correspond with the primary presenter only; it is the responsibility of the primary presenter to notify each co-presenter of pertinent information concerning the presentation.

2. Co-Presenters

Name, title, institution, address, phone, fax and email.
