In addition to service on various university advisory committees Elliott assists with coordination of the University Threat Assessment Team to facilitate timely and consistent response to campus threatening or potentially threatening behavior. Jeffrey has worked extensively with federal and state agencies, universities, and local governments promoting innovative criminal justice concepts.
