The International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators (IACLEA) was initially formulated by eleven college and university security directors. These eleven directors came together November 6, 1958, on the campus of Arizona State University to discuss job challenges and mutual problems, and specifically to create a clearinghouse for information and issues shared by campus directors across the country.

IACLEA's current membership is composed of colleges, universities and secondary schools throughout the United States, Canada, and other countries as well as individual campus law enforcement directors and staff, criminal justice faculty members, municipal chiefs of police, companies offering campus law enforcement products and services, and individuals who support professionalism in campus law enforcement administration.

The Association by virtue of its members has taken positive steps toward the future of our college and university campuses. IACLEA has developed an accreditation program for its member institutions. In conjunction with the Academy of Counter-Terrorist Education at Louisiana State University (LSU), IACLEA provided Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) Awareness Training to more than 1,700 campus public safety officers. IACLEA was Awarded a 1.5 million dollar grant from the U.S. Office of Domestic Preparedness to develop Incident Command System (ICS) training for campus public safety leaders and a U.S. Department of Justice COPS Office Grant to establish a National Center for Campus Public Safety. With almost a half century of experience, the International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators can look with pride to the past and with optimism to the future.

Professional Development

Training Programs

Through IACLEA's federal homeland security grant funding, members' command-level staff and their law enforcement training partners can attend free Incident Command System training classes held at regional campus-based sites. This three-day program covers critical incident management principles and utilizes a model campus simulator to provide hands-on training in managing a critical incident on your campus, whether it be a natural disaster or a catastrophic event. IACLEA's web-based Campus Preparedness Resource Center offers a wealth of resources, including model campus emergency operations plan guidelines, a guide to communications with first responders, and a strategic vision for WMD/all hazards campus preparedness training.

Leadership and Advocacy

IACLEA has received federal recognition as a leader in campus public safety. IACLEA was awarded federal funding to develop a strategic plan and business prospectus for the creation of a National Center for Campus Public Safety, a major step forward for the campus safety profession. IACLEA has also received federal homeland security grant funding to develop training programs and resources to protect our campuses from terrorism. Through our new Government Relations representative, IACLEA is well positioned to strengthen its bonds with federal law enforcement and higher education agencies.

Publications

The Campus Law Enforcement Journal is the voice of the IACLEA community. Each bimonthly Journal features articles on campus issues, professional training and development programs, updates on trends in law enforcement, and Association news. For the months the Journal is not published, IACLEA sends an e-newsletter to members with additional updates on news you can use. In addition, IACLEA offers over 15 publications dealing with specific problems or areas of current interest to its members at discounted prices.
